

02 Nights : Tea Castle Munnar

Day 01 : Pick up from Cochin, drive to Munnar, enroute Visit Cheeyapara Water falls, check in at the hotel, evening Town Visit & overnight stay at Munnar

Day 02 : After breakfast, visit Rajamalai (Closed during breeding season), Tea Museum (closed on Monday) , Mattupetty dam, Echo Point, Kundala Dam, Blossom Park & overnight stay at Munnar.

Munnar : Munnar is situated at the confluence of three mountain streams - Mudrapuzha, Nallathanni and Kundale. 1600 Meter above sea level. This hill station was once the summer resort of the erstwhile British government in South India. Sprawling Tea Plantation picture-book towns, winding lanes and holiday facility makes this a popular town. Local sightseeing of Munnar - visit Mattupetty Dam, Kundale Lake and Echo point. Afternoon proceed to Rajamalai where you can visit the rarest species known as "Nilgiri Tars".

Day 03 : After breakfast drive to Thekkady, check in at the hotel, optional spice plantation visit, boating, Elephant safari, & overnight stay at Thekkady.

Thekkady : Thekkady is one of the world's most fascinating wild life reserves, the Periyar wild life sanctuary spread across 777 Sq. KM. of which 360 Sq. KM is thick ever green forest. The Periyar wild life sanctuary was declared as a Tiger Reserve in 1978 noted for its geomorphology, diversity of wild life and scenic beauty.

Day 04 : After Breakfast, drive to Alleppey, check in at House boat, cruise through the lake & overnight stay at Alleppey.

Alleppey : With the Arabian Sea in the west and a vast network of Lakes, Lagoons and freshwater rivers criss-crossing it, Alappuzha is a district of immense natural beauty. Referred to as the Venice of east by travelers from across the world. This backwater country is home to diverse animal and bird life. By virtue of its proximity to the sea, the town has always enjoyed a unique place in the maritime history of Kerala. Today, Alappuzha is an important backwater destination attracting several thousand foreign tourists every year. Alappuzha is also famous for its boat races, beaches, marine products and coir industry. A singularity of this land is the region called "KUTTANAD" – a land of lush paddy fields referred to as the rice bowl of Kerala and one of the few places in the world where farming is done below sea level.

Day 05 : Drive to Cochin, check in at the hotel, visit Dutch Palace, (Friday holiday) Jewish Synagogue, (Friday & Saturday Holidays) Jewish Street, St. Francis Church (Sunday holiday) and Chinese Fishing Nets. & overnight stay at Cochin

Cochin : The commercial capital and most cosmopolitan city of Kerala, Cochin in Ernakulam is also known as “Queen of Arabian Sea” is one of the finest natural harbours in the World. This was one of the major centers for commerce and trade with British, Chinese, Portugese, Dutch etc. Sightseeing of Cochin – visit Dutch Palace, Jewish Synagogue, Jewish Street, St. Francis Church and Chinese Fishing Nets.

Day 06 : Drive to Cochin, Shopping and Drop
